1. Call to Order

Chip Dutcher called the Parks and Recreation Committee meeting for March 15, 2022 to order at 2:00 pm

2. Action on Minutes

a. January 18, 2022

3. Proposed Youth Helmet Ordinance a. Helmet Ordinance Template

Kirsten Frissora with the Health Department attended to give information on the Child Injury Prevention Program. This is a coalition with the state, the main focus is TDI prevention. Committee reviewed a proposed youth helmet ordinance, there are six to ten existing helmet ordinances in the state. Ms. Frissora said she is happy to be a resource in moving this forward if desired. Additionally noted a free helmet program at the health department. Committee will seek input on legislation from greater council, Bailey will work to fine tune the ordinance draft if desired.

4. State Capital Budget Projects

Proposing an amphitheater (1.2 mill) at Hannahs Park and a Splashpad (1.3 million) at the Trailhead Park. Representative Mark Fraizer said he would submit both of these for State Capital Budget projects. Sharon asks for pickle ball courts.

5. Trailhead Park updates

Working to fix muddy areas. Fence to be installed to keep people from driving from dog park parking lot on Douglas to parking lot at path.

6. Johnstown RR Station - discussion

Jim Blair has approached Mr. Looker and has had discussion on donation of train station.

Since the Intel news, he has had realtors inquiring on buying. Keith Ryan contacted a house mover, \$30k to move it to the Trailhead park, under \$10k for a foundation, \$10k for other improvements/roof. Discussion on what it could be used for and where it could go. Committee will continue to explore.

7. Licking Park District updates

Dick Mosely provided updates. Reported deed of transfer for Concord Road property, will begin construction on the parking lot. Shared information on Newell Park; ribbon cutting for bikeway on June 22nd.

8. Downtown Johnstown, Inc. updates

Craig Bohning provided updates. Clean Sweep May 21st, Change Gears June 4th, Springfest June 18th, Summerfest August 27th , Car Show September 18th.

Discussion on holiday wreaths for downtown light poles; Jack said electricity on the poles has been fixed.

9. Greater Johnstown Recreation District updates

Keith Ryan reported that Ice Miller is working pro-bono to get the group 501c3 tax exempt status.

1. Call to Order

Committee Chair Marvin Block called the Parks and Recreation Committee meeting for April 19, 2022 to order at 10:03 am

2. State Capital Budget; Project Updates

Chip Dutcher noted that Mark Frazier held a round table, attendees were mostly Jersey Township. TID has asked for a letter of support for Federal funding; said he owes Director mastodon info, she was very interested.

3. Trailhead Park updates

Three trees to be planted at the park.

TLV started drainage work at the Dog Park. When the ground dries up they will get the parking lot base in. Road condition discussion.

Support cables were put in the large oak tree at the dog park

Sharon Hendren expressed her opposition to the splash pad and listed some cons and concerns. Discussion on the pros and the community desire to have one. Discussion on potential maintenance costs, staff to consult Prime Engineering who provided the design.

4. Johnstown RR Station updates

Discussion on relocation to the Trailhead Park. \$30k cost estimate to move; with some other work needed \$50k all in cost. Marvin Block noted another company to seek for an estimate. Investigation to continue.

5. Licking Park District updates

Richard Waugh provided updates and expressed excitement for the upgrades happening at the Jersey Street/Trailhead Park. Noted another commitment on Tuesdays and the need to leave early.

Concord Road parking lot; waiting for ground to dry before work can begin, there will be around twelve spaces.

August 13th will be Peddle to Produce, based on MORPC idea to get more people out on the bike path. Farmers Market at one end. Richard will email the info.

The Licking Park District was approached by a Trustee of the Longwell Miles Estate; noted likelihood of the property transfer. Richard noted open communication with Johnstown.

More information to follow.

1. Call to Order

Committee Chair Marvin Block called the meeting to order at 10:05 am

2. Roll Call

3. Other Business

No planned agenda topics; general discussion.

1. Marvin Block; discussion on the potential for acquiring the train depot and/or property and the ability to move the train depot down to the Trailhead, or to leave where it is.

Committee discussion on a long range plan for that area and potential function of the CIC and/or Downtown Johnstown Inc. Marvin Block and Craig Bohning to speak with the train depot property owner to discuss options. Jack Liggett talked about the storm sewers in that area being in poor condition and the need for renovation or replacement. Discussion on flooding with heavy rains and where the storm sewers drain, Jack and Marvin provided some history of the storm water system.

2. Chip Dutcher; updated that the city was successful in receiving State Capital Budget money; \$150,000 for the Splash Pad (\$1.3 million project) and \$250,000 for the Amphitheatre (\$1.2 million project). The money cannot be interchanged or consolidated; Fraizer and the city were hopeful for larger dollar amounts toward both projects. Discussion on applying for more budget funds each year and working on the projects in phases.

Discussion on location of the splash pad, potential for moving to Hannahs Park, Sean Stanearth and Bailey Morlan to identify some other areas and parking.

3. Jack Liggett; the mulch in the playground area is not deep enough, it has been a number of years since they have put anything down. Needs one hundred cubic yards of playground certified mulch which will likely cost \$3,500 - \$4,000. Discussion on whether or not this was budgeted.

4. Craig Bohning; Downtown Johnstown Inc. has decided to purchase the wreaths for the light poles along Main Street, they have put fifty percent down and are discussing sponsorships, Mr. Block said he would sponsor/pay for one. There are twelve poles, the wreaths cost \$500 each, total cost \$6,000.

5. Dick Moseley; now that ground is drying out work can begin on the Concord Road parking lot. Also, the dedication of the new bikeway section, that ties Delaware and Knox Counties together, dedication is Saturday, June 25th at 10:00 am at Newell Park

6. Jack Liggett; added that they still get a lot of complaints that the dog gates are still not closing properly. Bailey to reach out to Tony Baldwin/Baldwin Fence.

7. Sean Stanart; reviewed General Park budget funds available after discussion with Finance Director. Committee review of expenses paid out; conclusion is that there is money in the budget for the mulch.

No further business. The meeting adjourned at 11:09 am.
