Minutes of the meeting May 5, 2020 5:00 pm
(Virtual)

Meeting came to order at 5:04 pm; Committee members present: Lee, Block

Staff present: Jim Lenner, Jack Liggett, Chief Haroon, Chip Dutcher, Bailey Klimchak, Teresa Monroe

Public present: None

Action on minutes: March 3, 2020

Mr. Block moved to approve minutes as written, Mr. Lee seconded and motion carried 2-0.

Local Waste Service; resident complaint: Issue has been addressed to customer's satisfaction.

Updated construction timeline; 2020 season:

- Westview is being delayed for gas line removal, no definitive date on gas company doing their work which prolongs village project. Unsure on completion timeline.
- Valleyview and Jersey Street trunk line sewer going on as scheduled; phase one is the sewer lining and repair of main sewer that runs behind Valleyview and phase two is construction of the Jersey Street relief sewer that runs from Valleyview to the sewer plant; getting ready to bid phase one. Jack Liggett said he anticipates completion for both phases this year.
- Upham Drive storm sewer went in today; all lines installed and taps changed, now just reclamation of yards and paving to fix where road was cut.
- Benedict; three services are moved off line to be abandoned, project done with the exception of yard reclamation and paving to fix where road was cut.
- Kasson Street; good progress, sidewalk and curbs are in and will be ready for paving. Completion expected within thirty days.

Discussion on the gas line contractor delay for Westview; reason given was backlog of jobs due to Covid-19 and time they were shut down. Mayor Dutcher brought attention to repairs needed to resident properties from the Upham Drive project; Jack Liggett will address. Oregon Phase three is money dependent, still needs gas lines moved, delayed to 2021 start. Benedict is part of the Route 62 project; Jim Lenner updated on phase two for 2021; easements needed, curb and gutter for entirety of section except for one hundred feet west of the bridge, will be tapered. There will be an underground storm water management structure similar to Concord Road, there could be an nominal up charge for decorative mast arms, will have estimates to decide on in advance; right now the total cost of project is \$880,000. Bigelow will be built to standards that will allow a future signal.

Chief PD Stats review; 2020 trends: Chief Haroon reviewed stats compared to this time last year; he noted he has given the green light for officers to once again conduct traffic stops as normal because speed is a problem and is the number one cause of fatal accidents in Ohio. Noted domestics are up fifty percent compared to this time last year, likely due to Covid-19 and people staying home. Reviewed a few specific incidence calls within the village.

Disorderly Conduct Ordinance/Noise: This topic has been in committee previously, recent complaints of the public give cause for continued review. Chief Haroon said he has been reviewing models from other cities for an ordinance on disturbing the peace; a draft was presented and reviewed with committee. There was discussion on some specific sections of the draft and enforcement.

Motion: Mr. Lee moved to send the draft with notes discussed on to the Law Director for proposal into ordinance; Mr. Block seconded and motion carried 2-0.

Other business:

1. Mr. Lee asked if there were any updates on the I&I study results; Mr. Liggett said most of their efforts as far as the money being spent for the CIP I&I study have been on Valleyview and Jersey Streets in preparing for this project, slow going because only running one operator at a time.

2. Mr. Lee attended a meeting on Friday regarding the fireworks celebration and planning; most likely will be postponing the July 3rd date to a later date.

3. Mr. Block commended staff on the job done under difficult circumstances, special recognition to Mr. Liggett for getting on board ahead of time and keeping his crew separated to avoid a department wide infliction of Covid-19 which could have been especially detrimental to the water department; he appreciates all the work staff has done.

4. Mr. Liggett asked if there were updates on the Firemen's Festival; Mr. Lenner said meetings currently being held and updates will be provided when known, but his opinion was that it would be hard to hold with all of the restrictions in place. Mr. Dutcher noted several communities are moving events to Labor Day.

Adjourn: Mr. Block moved to adjourn, Mr. Lee seconded. Motion carried 2-0; meeting adjourned at 5:53 pm.
