11. Public Hearings of Legislation

a. **ORDINANCE 38-2020** AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING CHAPTER 1171.04 ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF JOHNSTOWN, OHIO. *Introduced December 8, 2020*

Planner Bailey Klimchak provided background saying this Ordinance was forwarded from the Planning and Zoning Commission and would allow Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU) in the village. Rules within the Ordinance would only allow ADU's in SR and RR zoning districts at this time but potential for extension to PUD etc.; the Ordinance also regulates structure size and how many people can live in the ADU. Planning and Zoning would like to see this geared toward family members but it is understood that would be hard to regulate fully.

Ben Lee said there was much deliberation on this to get the result presented; he said he would like to see this tabled tonight as there are some additional items related to ADU's that may need to be discussed in Planning and Zoning to shore up some unintended consequences from the legislation. Mr. Lee said he still thinks ADU's are valid and would serve a need within the community but in his opinion some pieces such as lot coverage requirements need to be reviewed again by Planning and Zoning.

Ms. Hendren expressed concern for the ADU becoming a rental if the family member were to pass away. Ms. Klimchak said it would be hard to regulate telling the owner they could not rent out the unit.

Ms. Robertson asked why the village would want to have this as an option and increase rentals when that is not something we want; the village wants more home ownership. She said she would not like to see this in her neighborhood; she believes it would lower property values, if someone wants their mom or dad to live with them, they should expand their house or add a room etc. Ms. Robertson asked if Westerville or Dublin had anything like this. Ms. Klimchak said so far no; staff looked at Yellow Springs and Hudson in Ohio. Ms. Robertson said she does not see this being good for the village; she is totally against it and agrees on tabling.

Ms. Hendren said she also is against this being allowed on smaller lots like in Concord Crossing. Mr. Lee said currently PUD (Concord Crossing) would not be included.

Ms. Van Deest said she would like to continue studying this and asked Ms. Klimchak to get some feedback from Hudson and Yellow Springs about how it's working out; she is still considering and not totally opposed.

Zoning Inspector Jim Blair said the only zoning district in the village, as the legislation is currently presented, that an ADU would be allowed would be in Raccoon Creek Estates and the cost of putting one of these on your property would likely be \$70-80,000. Mr. Block noted that the HOA may not even allow.

- b. **ORDINANCE 39-2020** AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING SECTION 171.08, USE OF ELECTRONICALLY CREATED CITATIONS, IN THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF JOHNSTOWN, OHIO. *Introduced December 8, 2020*

Public Hearing: There were no comments by the public either for or against.

Mr. Block asked Chief Haroon if he found out what the cost was going to be to get everything needed. Chief Haroon said it looked like there would not be any upfront cost, may possibly be a need for cables, eight dollars each for five vehicles, but unknown until the devices come in. Said if he were to write and be approved for the grant, it would cover the mounting brackets, printers and the initial paper, and then the paper cost itself is cheaper than the physical copy paper being used now.

Chief Haroon noted this legislation is only so the court will recognize e-citations and allow him to write the grant and if approved the equipment would be provided. Ms. Van Deest asked if this could be used in any other positions and if Chief had any experience with e-tickets being used in other municipalities; Chief Haroon said not directly, the Licking County Sheriff's office uses now; he elaborated on other uses for the printer and paper. Chief Haroon re-stated that this just approves the Ordinance to recognize the use so even if we decide not to use them this year or next, if it is ten years from now before they are used, we won't have to go through this process again, it just gives the foundation that the village will recognize the use of electronic citations.

- c. **RESOLUTION 2021-01** A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE MANAGER TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, AND ENTER INTO A WATER SUPPLY REVOLVING LOAN ACCOUNT (WSRLA) AGREEMENT ON BEHALF OF THE VILLAGE OF JOHNSTOWN FOR CONSTRUCTION OF WATER FACILITIES; AND DESIGNATE A DEDICATED REPAYMENT SOURCE FOR THE LOAN.

Mr. Lenner said the village applied for and was accepted into this program, the letter of interest was approved and now we need to formally apply. Decision is to apply for three million dollars for the water tower; there is opportunity for a zero interest loan or potentially a grant. If awarded, this will free up bond money reserved for the water tower to do something else, Village Engineer is helping to facilitate the grant writing, we won't know the official terms until award. Depending on approval timelines, it could push back the bid date of the water tower, currently set for mid to late February.

Ms. Van Deest inquired on the dollar amount, she thought previously the tower quote was only two million dollars; Mr. Lenner said she was correct and discussed some reasons for the increased amount. Mr. Liggett noted there will be options for the type of tower, decisions will be made based on construction and life maintenance costs. Mr. Lenner said the color scheme is the red band and block letters to match existing tower, there was no objection of Council.

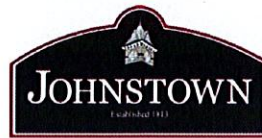

Finance Director's Report to Council
January 19th, 2021

1. Tax Revenue. Total Income Tax revenue collected through December 2020 was \$2,108,046. This represents 95.6% of 2020 Budgeted Income Tax revenue of \$2,205,000, and a 0.5% decrease from 2019 total collections.

The largest source of the Village's income tax revenue, withholding taxes derived from individuals working in Johnstown, increased 2.9% while individual returns decreased 4.3%, and business net profits decreased by 6.4% as compared to 2019.

The graph below illustrates the Village's annual income tax revenue from 2016 through 2020:

Withholding taxes continue to increase every year since 2015; this can be attributed to an increase in the number of jobs and increased pay rates in Johnstown. While several companies have reported decreases in their withholding taxes from the prior year (e.g., Landmark Global \$12k, Defense Finance \$10k, Bleckmann \$9k, Tech Rubber \$5k), there were many that reported increases (e.g., Ghostwriter \$8K, Franklin County \$8K, Franklin Township BD/Trustees \$6.6K, Crow Works \$6K, Ohio Pack \$6K). Overall, the increases outweighed the decreases when compared with 2019.

Individual income tax collections are higher when compared with 2016, 2017 & 2018, but down compared to 2019. Increases are related to both population and economic growth. The current year decrease is likely related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The **2020 Net Profit** revenue is down primarily due to several companies reporting losses, including an \$18K refund for Thirty-One Gifts, a \$21k decrease at Porter Pizza Box, and a \$13K decrease reported by Atrium Apparel Corp. These and other losses were partially offset by increases reported by: Apeks \$23.6k, Key Cuts \$6k, Coughlin Ford \$5.6K, and numerous others.

2. Revenues and Expenditures. See attached spreadsheets for 2020 year-to-date revenue collections and expenditures.

Notes on Revenue:

General Fund, Permits Fines & Licenses – \$4.5K was received in December for engineering deposits on the Monroe Township Fire Station. \$9K in cable franchise revenues were received.

General Fund, Misc – A third rebate for 2020 was received from the Bureau of Worker's Compensation. \$71,053.12 was the amount of the December check.

Street Construction & Repair and State Highway & Improvement Funds both ended the year lower than budget.

Right-of-Way Fund did not collect the full budgeted amount. Based on what was billed by our ROW administrator, the actual revenues look to be lower than expected. Also, we are still awaiting payment from CenturyLink.

Sewer Operating Fund \$1,145,980, or 149% of the revenue budget has been collected for the year. Of this, \$372,500 was related to bulk sewer hauling for New Day Farms and Trillium Farms. Without these collections, we have received 100% of revenue budget.

Water/Sewer Improvements Fund has collected 100%+ of their respective budgets due primarily to Bond proceeds and eighty (80) new homes permitted YTD. Of the Bond proceeds, \$5.77M was for Water Projects and \$1.5M for Sewer Projects.

Enterprise Deposit Fund has collected 129% of budget due to a higher number of home sales/rental activity than was budgeted.

Notes on Expense:

General Fund, Recreation Dept \$8k was budgeted for a ped counter which has been reappropriated in 2021.

General Fund, Zoning \$20k was re-appropriated in 2021 for Design regs.

General Fund, Economic Development The fees payable to the Johnstown Community Improvement Corporation have been appropriated in 2021.

Capital Projects. Only 36% spent due to the increase in revenue for the Bond issuance. This increased the budgeted revenue by \$1,360,000, and these funds will be spent throughout the year or re-appropriated in 2021.

Water & Sewer Replacement & Improvement Funds are barely spent due to the appropriations related to the new enterprise center on Duncan Plains Road. \$360k is appropriated for Water lines, \$930k is appropriated for sewer lines. Additionally, \$5,75M in water projects and \$1.5M in sewer projects were bonded and appropriated, to be spent in 2020 or re-appropriated in 2021.

3. BWC Rebate. We received a rebate of \$71, 028 in December, \$19,070 in November, and \$18,347 in April bringing the total rebate received to \$108,446 in 2020.

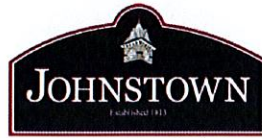

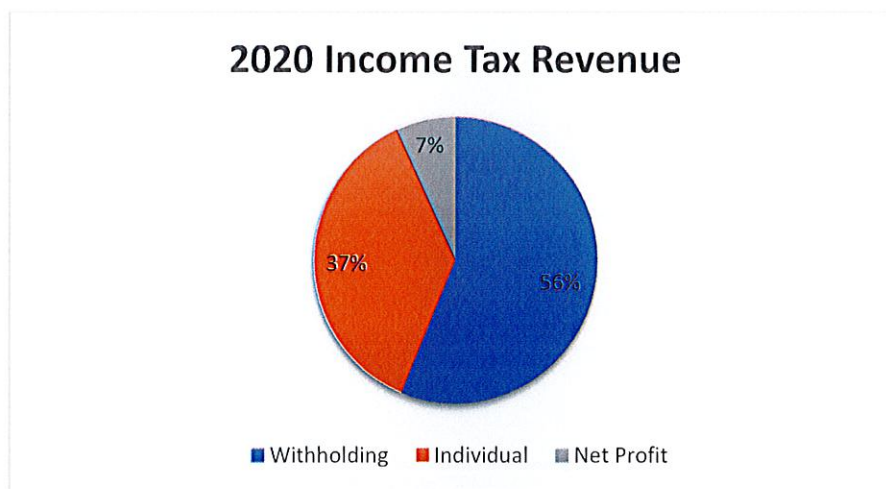

Financial Update – 2020

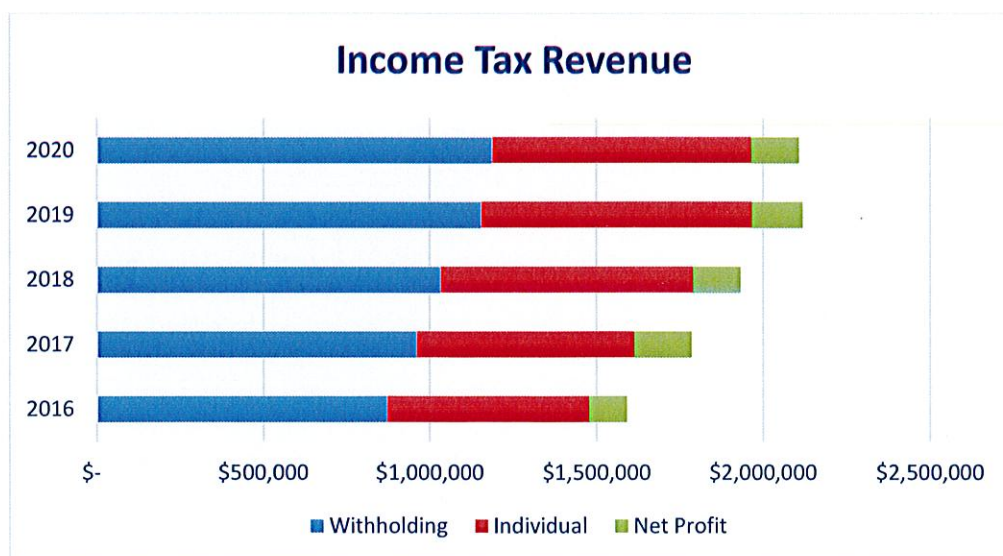
Income Tax Revenues

In the 2020 Operating Budget, the Finance Department projected \$2,205,000 in revenue from the local income tax, with 70.0% or \$1,543,500 programmed in the General Fund, and 30.0% or \$661,500 programmed in the Capital Improvements and Debt Service Funds. This estimate was based on an assumption of a 16.0% increase over the 2019 tax revenue estimate. However, our actual income tax revenue for 2019 exceeded the estimate by 12.0%. Compared to 2018 income tax revenue, our 2019 collections increased 9.3%.



The largest source of Johnstown's income tax revenue, withholding taxes derived from individuals working in Johnstown, increased 2.9% when compared to 2019. Individual returns decreased 4.3%, and business net profits decreased by 6.4% when compared to 2019.

Individual income tax collections have been increasing from 2014-2019, (22.0%, 34.8%, 7.5%, and 16.2%, and 7.4%) with a decrease of 4.3% from 2019-2020. The increases from 2014-2019 have resulted primarily from the repealed municipal tax credit (2015), and in more recent years, local economic growth. The decrease from 2019-2020 is largely attributable to the COVID-19 pandemic. Projections for 2021 income tax revenue are being held steady with actual receipts in 2020.

Withholding taxes have been increasing steadily since 2014, and 2020 was no exception. This upswing can be attributed to an increase in the number of jobs and pay rates in Johnstown, and related economic growth.

Property Tax Revenues

Property tax revenue in 2020 totaled \$263,070 which was distributed to the General Fund.

General Fund

General Fund revenue totaled \$3,020,150 in 2020. This was an increase of \$161,961 or 5.7% over the 2019 YTD receipts. A breakdown of the revenues is as follows:

While income tax revenue is usually the most influential on the General Fund's overall revenue position, an increase in revenue from other categories helped contribute to the overall increase in revenue of the General Fund. Notable variances between the revenue received in 2020 versus 2019 are as follows:

Intergovernmental Revenues – The primary source of this revenue is local government funding, which is based on the general revenues from the State of Ohio. There was a \$4k increase in funding in 2020 compared to 2019. Liquor & Beer Permit revenue increased by \$8k in 2020 compared to 2019.

Fines, Licenses and Permits – Much of the revenue generated in this category is a function of development activity throughout the Village. Several new construction projects beginning in 2020 have driven this increase, including Johnstown Pointe rehabilitation home, Centex Homes development- Raccoon Creek Preserve, and the new Monroe Township Fire Station to name only a few.

Miscellaneous – Included in this line item are contributions & donations, shelter house rental income, and other misc revenues. In 2020 we received \$20k in recreation donations for park projects, \$108k in rebates from the Bureau of Worker's Compensation, and \$20k was received as Payment in Lieu of Taxes from New Day Farms.

General Fund expenditures in 2020 totaled \$2,814,460 which was an increase of 1.5% or \$42,022 over 2019.

The increase in Personal Services is due to the increasing of wages across all departments. Additionally, the Village Manager's contract was extended and rate of pay increased. Health insurance costs also rose. Expenditures for non-personal services have decreased overall as compared to 2019. Transfers refer to a percentage of income tax revenue that is transferred to the Debt Service and Capital Improvements Funds, pursuant to section 191.013 of the Village's Codified Ordinances. As these revenues fluctuate, the transfers do the same. A minimum of 28% of income tax revenue must be transferred to Debt & Capital Improvements. In 2020, the Finance department chose to transfer 30% of revenue, which was the same percentage transferred in 2019.

CAD is live. There were some significant issues to overcome with communications. However, they were resolved with an updated VPN (virtual private network) and updated vehicle hotspots.

At any given time, dispatchers and supervisors can see the location of patrol cars (updated in real-time as they are in motion). Officer have provided feedback that the reporting has been easier and is increasing their productivity.

Statistical reports and documentation reports are more streamlined, professional, and easily obtained.

Network:

Same issues are persistent. There may be a problem with the 5-gigahertz spectrum on our network. Dynamic Network is working to resolve the issue.

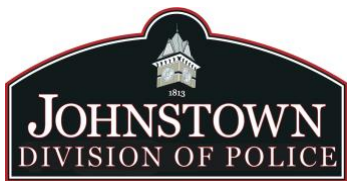
Digital folders have been created to house digital files. Officers and dispatches are now able to store their own videos, photos, and other digital information in the digital storage area.

ORDINANCE 38-2020

**AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING CHAPTER 1171.04 ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS OF THE
CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF JOHNSTOWN, OHIO.**

WHEREAS, the Village Council of Johnstown, Ohio wishes to provide an alternative housing option to residents in the Village; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of these regulations are to permit accessory dwelling units on private residential property in the Village of Johnstown provided certain standards are met; and

WHEREAS, The Village Council finds that allowing accessory dwelling units in Johnstown would promote ageing-in-place and diversify the housing opportunities within the Village; and

WHEREAS, Accessory dwelling units provide a unique opportunity for the Village; however they also bring regulation challenges; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF JOHNSTOWN, OHIO,
LICKING COUNTY, STATE OF OHIO;**

Section One. That Chapter 1171.04 Accessory Dwelling Units is hereby established as attached in "Exhibit A" and incorporated herein.

Section Two. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that meetings of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action where meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code and the Charter for Johnstown, OHIO.

Chapter 1171

Supplementary District Regulations

1171.04 ACCESSORY DWELLING UNITS

Accessory dwelling units shall be conditionally permitted in SR and RR residential districts, subject to Chapter 1131. Accessory dwelling units will be considered as accessory structures for the purposes of 1171.03 (b). All accessory dwelling units must follow the zoning district development standards as well as the following conditions and requirements:

- (a) An accessory dwelling unit may be located within a principal single-family detached dwelling or a detached accessory building on the same lot as a principal dwelling.
- (b) There shall not be more than one accessory dwelling structure on a lot in addition to the principal single-family dwelling and other permitted accessory structures.
- (c) The owner of the lot must live in the primary residence.
- (d) Accessory dwellings shall be;
 - a. A minimum of 400 square feet and a maximum of 800 square feet in SR districts, and
 - b. A minimum of 400 square feet and a maximum of 1,000 square feet in the RR district.
- (e) A detached accessory dwelling must be assigned a separate mailing address.
- (f) A minimum of one off-street parking space shall be provided on the lot for the accessory dwelling unit in addition to the off-street parking spaces required for the principal dwelling unit. Reference 1175.10 Parking Space Requirements
- (g) The accessory dwelling shall contain a living area, one bath and a kitchenette (including a refrigerator, microwave oven and/or stove, and sink) and may contain no more than one bedroom. Each unit must also have a permanent foundation.
- (h) Accessory dwelling units will have separate water and sewer taps.
- (i) No more than two adults shall occupy the accessory dwelling unit.
- (j) No new access points or driveways shall be created or installed for access to the accessory dwelling unit except for lots zoned Rural Residential.
- (k) The accessory dwelling shall have a roof pitch and design character that matches that of the primary dwelling and shall be no more than one story. Reference Johnstown's Design Review Districts and Standards and Chapters 1171.12 and 1187.
